The cost of quitting is greater than the cost of continuing.

The cost of quitting is greater than the cost of continuing the course. This became revelation to me one day as a missionary in Scotland as I was taking time alone with the Lord. It was a season when it was hard to serve and obey the Lord. Even if things are uncom-

fortable, lonely or uncertain, I realized that quitting was not an option. It is not the price I want to pay.

"Yes" is the answer I will give when God asks something of me. It could be a mission, an idea that I know is God inspired or just an opportunity to be obedient. This was tested over the years. One very vivid occasion was when I was headed to the airport to go to the Dominican Republic with a group of health care workers among whom I knew no one. Obedience was beautiful as I was able to help stamp out blindness through cataract surgery and meet many needs for restored eyesight.

"But, seek first his kingdom and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33). This is a life gem for me. My part is to seek first His kingdom! God does not need my help, worries, reminders or record keeping!

Pace yourself! This revelation came to my husband and me in the first few months of marriage. We will cover a greater distance, last longer and accomplish more if we pace ourselves! A marathon runner can go a lot further than a sprinter! Our goal was to serve our Lord all of our lives and not quit, burn out, become bitter or drop out of the race. My only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace.

The world's amazing game-changers did just this: they stayed the course, didn't get mad, bitter, disillusioned or quit, but obediently took one day at a time. I am inspired to moving forward, and trust God to use my life for His glory.

The DOVE network is also growing in Kenya, the Philippines, Myanmar and many other locations.



STUDYING the BIBLE in SECRET

New believer hides God's Word in his heart

Saeed* heard about Jesus from DOVE missionaries in his town. Coming from an Islamic home, he had never interacted with Christians until his parents took him to Grace Academy* for extra coaching in the subjects he was struggling with at school.

Saeed's home island is almost entirely Muslim and as a teenager, he needs to adhere to the Muslim code of conduct for his own survival. But when Saeed learned about the sacrifice of Jesus for his salvation, he had a strong desire to know that Jesus. Missionaries Tom and Ruth* led him to Christ, and started

teaching him the Bible. Saeed loves the Bible and wants to study it, but dare not read it any time apart from when he is at school.

Tom had an idea. He started writing verses on a small piece of paper that Saeed could take with him. Saeed diligently studies those verses between the time he leaves school and the time he reaches home. Before getting home, he throws the papers in a pit latrine, having memorized them already. Saeed has been "hiding God's Word in his heart" for almost one year now, and the Word of God is working great things in his

life. Saeed is just one of several young people who have accepted Christ and are being mentored in faith in the undercover protection of Grace Academy.

The Christmas season provides us a unique opportunity to talk about Jesus. Only at Christmas do we have this freedom. In 2018, we held campaigns in thirty villages where we distributed Bibles, showed the Jesus film and performed dramas. God is opening the door wide in Punjab as people are responding to the gospel like never before.

Distribution of Bibles brings amazing testimonies of people coming to salvation when they read God's Word.

Kishan, a new believer, said he was praying for a Bible, then God heard his prayers when we gave him a Bible. Savitri said she is the only person who can read and write in her house. Now that she has a Bible she reads it loudly so that others in her home can hear God's Word.

Another outreach tool is to provide water through digging boreholes. This is one of the best platforms for

starting new churches. People become very receptive when we bring muchneeded water to their villages.

Our state, with a population of over 27 million, is the birthplace for the Sikh religion. During a recent leadership meeting, God touched many next generation leaders and six decided to go to new regions for church planting. Seven other missionary couples, already trained in Bible school, are preparing to start churches in remote villages.

This was me. I was a highly functioning angry, bipolar and rejected woman, wife, worship leader and homeschool mom. Every Sunday I would put on a

smile sit at the keyboard and worship with abandon. But I desperately needed something to change in my life.

quently angry and constantly spewed out rejection. Yet it was a Christian home. As an adult, I was attempting to homeschool my girls but would often become so incredibly angry over silly things. In

hey say we are the sum of all our parts, but for many of us, our parts are broken or wounded. Our hearts want to be free, but we become so acquainted with the brokenness that at times we don't even know it is there.

I grew up in a family that was fre-

time, I began to see the same anger in my girls and in how they treated each other. I knew something about spiritual warfare, inner healing and generational issues. So as I was sitting and crying after I had smacked my daughter just because she could not answer a question, (she has forgiven me!) I knew I couldn't go on like this. It was ruining my girls, my marriage and myself.

During a quiet morning of personal prayer, I repented of my anger, my dad's anger, and generations of anger in my family line. I had seen and lived with this anger long enough. I prayed to break it off my life and my daughters' lives. I prayed that I would be the one to end this sin in my generation and let God bring His peace into my family.

That same night, I had a vivid dream. I was fighting a huge animal that resembled a man. He was throwing me against the bedroom wall. I kept being picked up and thrown into the closet doors, floor and wall. I could see everything as it was happening, as if in slow motion, but it was my bedroom and very real. All the while I kept saying, "I am breaking this generational curse. It will not be in my family" and kept crying, "Jesus."

When I woke the next morning I knew something had changed. Getting out of bed, I felt extremely sore. I looked and the whole side of my body was bruised, as if I had been thrown against something. I stared at myself in the mirror. Then my phone rang, and a very dear intercessor and mentor asked, "Kim, are you okay?" She said she had seen me battling the night before, and God wanted her to tell me: "It is finished." I then told Connection

her about my dream. She explained that the battle was real—a huge fight—but the anger was now broken over my life.

It was true. The issues of anger and bipolar had left. I felt a huge peace over myself, my home and my family. My relationship with my girls changed.I began to enjoy them and laugh more, instead of the constant burning of anger.

In Galatians 3:13 we are told Jesus is the curse-breaker. Everyone must be willing to go to battle against things that keep us bound, even things we might not know are there. Although I have never felt freeer than I do right now, I know there is more to come. My story is still in the making; watch for the next chapter!

Prayer changes nations

DOVE International's "2020 Challenge" has given us the goal of growing to be 1,000 churches by the year 2020. In the years of pursuing this goal, we realized early on that prayer would play a crucial role in seeing God birth new churches. DOVE Mission International took on the task of mobilizing prayer missionaries to go to numerous sites around the world where local leaders had a specific vision for church planting. The purpose was to support that vision and do the work of prayer to see it become reality.



TANZANIA

A prayer team trekked through the city of Tanga to pray at the port, government offices and financial institutions. They did prophetic action at the sea shore to defeat a spirit of slavery discerned to be holding back revival.

CANADA

Lynn Ironside said of the team in Quebec, "We arrived with open minds and hearts anticipating what the Lord would reveal for the city of Sherbrooke. As we walked through it, we prayed and declared the Kingdom of God present in the court rooms, cafés, churches and on the snow-covered streets."

BULGARIA and THE NETHERLANDS

An international team spent three days in each nation to claim the ground and pray for breakthroughs. As a result, greater fruit is expected in church planting.

MYANMAR

A prayer team joined the believers there to pray over areas that are targeted for planting new churches.

COLOMBIA

From this team, Adriana Muñoz comments, "We won't forget how it felt to sense a diabolic throne in the spirit realm falling and a celestial throne being restored as we worshipped."

INDIA

Intercessors focused on specific scriptures for growth and multiplication in many remote villages. They even prayed at the top of a hill that has huge idols, breaking strongholds over a city. Leaders there were deeply encouraged.

Regardless of what life threw at them, they maintained their vows and

lifelong marriage commitment to God and one another. They recognized the value of a covenant and the significance of a marriage that shows the world how much Christ loves His church.

Regardless of where you are in your marriage, there is help and there is hope. If God is who He says He is, then every marriage scenario can be redeemed. If He could forgive the woman who had committed adultery and had obviously failed in her marriage, He can forgive you and rebuild your relationship.

t is always an inspiration to visit rural churches across East African nations. Our trip to Uganda was no exception. I am challenged to touch the simple, unassuming faith of those who seem to have little—according to the world's measure—yet have so much in the Lord.



"When we first planted this church, every night was 'deliverance night.' The neighbor-

hood had so much demonic oppression that it was even hard to sleep," explained Raphael Nguchie, leader of Christ-in-U, a network newly engaged with DOVE. Now, the Karuma celebration only has one 'deliverance service' a week; other nights members gather for intercession, worship or teachings. This, in addition to Sunday services. "The village is so different now; it is really 'cleaned up' and full of zeal," Raphael testifies.

Riding across the countryside in the back of an open truck, live chickens and charcoal in tow, accented the thrill of seeing God's power penetrate darkness in the region. Praise God. He is alive!

NETHERLANDS Fashioned by God's love

"What do you find beautiful about yourself?"

I asked this of a woman I was coaching in my fashion consultant's academy. She started crying because she has never seen herself as beautiful. As we talked more, I shared the struggles I had as a girl, being insecure and feeling I had nothing to give. I talked about how God changed my heart. That really touched her and she asked if we could talk again. This is one example of the opportunities I have to share my testimony of walking with God in my business, *Mooi Opleidingen*.

Besides the fashion consultancy, I also have an academy where I train women to start their own consultant businesses. Some people wonder why I am doing this as a Christian. They question: "Isn't it very worldly to focus on outward appearance? Isn't the 'inside' what is important?" But when I work with a client, I start with questions. Many women open up during these conversations and talk about poor

self-image, fear of

people or fear of their past. It is then easy to take the step of telling them about God and how He sees us! I often share my story about how I became close to God, and even pray for them.

On the last day of the academy, when they receive certificates, I write a letter for each one. Along with the academic report, I prophesy over them in these letters. I ask God to give me words of life for them. We always end this day with a lot of tears because God is touching them through these words.

Isn't God amazing? I have my own business and am doing what I love, positioned right where God wants me so I can reach women with the message of God's love.

Spiritual multiplication and reproduction must extend to every sphere of kingdom life and ministry. n 2017, the theme of the DOVE ILC was "The Next Step." Participants were encouraged to seek God for the one step He was asking them to take. For Samy and Shireen Kengela, the Lord's instructions were clear. He was calling them to step out in faith and plant a church.

The Kengela's started talking with their pastors of House of Praise in Cape Town about this vision. Another year passed. When Samy attended ILC in 2018, things became more clear and the Lord confirmed that "the time is now".



In June 2018 Samy and Shireen were released to plant The Worship Centre. Shireen explains, "We started by refreshing the church with DOVE's Biblical Foundations Series and have seen God correcting foundations that were wrongly built. As the truth of His Word is taught, we see salvation, restored marriages and excitement about God's Word," The lounge where they meet is already too small, and they are trusting God to expand the building as soon as possible. "What an exciting journey of growing together," Kengela's declare.

RWANDA Churches reopen after government shutdown

Last year, the government of Rwanda shut down over 6,000 churches around the country. Requirements such as sound proofing, fire extinguishers, better restroom facilities, larger parking lots and Bible college diplomas for pastors were cited as the reasons for this drastic move. Meeting in homes is also illegal, so believers are facing a very difficult task to remain in fellowship and discipleship in this hostile environment.

Out of the ten DOVE churches in Rwanda, seven were shut down. At Kanombe church, DOVE's church in the capital city of Rwanda, the parking lot, sound proofing and washroom work was done, thanks to generous support from the DOVE International family worldwide. Other DOVE members who live in the vicinity are now attending this church. God is restoring hope!


Healing message changes lives in difficult times

This atmosphere makes evangelism and church planting very difficult, because travel is usually not safe and insecurity abounds. Whole populations find themselves on the move. A more stable nation will pave the way for rigorous church planting.

The message of healing, especially from trauma and loss, is much needed. Of course, Christ IS our Healer. As DOVE DRC shares the hope and healing that comes from the Lord, many are coming to a life of faith.

IRELAND Relating is key

The spiritual climate in Ireland has changed over the past two years with the legalization of both abortion and partnerships between same-sex couples. This increase in liberalism is bringing a noticeable spiritual vacuum; people are yearning for genuine relationships and authentic faith.

The DOVE church in Ireland focuses outreach on the local college, a soup kitchen and youth. Members are active in raising funds for the kitchen by packing bags at a grocery store.

James Krechnyak, who gives oversight to the work in Ireland, gives seminars on discipleship and house/micro churches. There is a growing interest in Ireland for micro churches, especially because of the relational aspect of small groups and mutual support. As the DOVE church grows, they intend to multiply the unique micro church model.

SCOTLAND Creative community outreach

The outreach of Living Waters Community Church in Peterhead, Scotland focuses on building relationships of trust and transparency. During the summer months, we enjoy evening small groups and open barbeques. We also hold movie and pizza or fish and chips nights, a Scottish standard. Quite a few non-Christians attend these events and usually enquire when the next one will be. We also open our building to local groups with needs, for example an Alzheimer's group and a mental health group. The Alpha course we use has proved to be an effective tool for leading people to Christ.

In all of these, we demonstrate God's love and have opportunities to share the gospel.

PHILIPPINES

Making the love of Christ real

ow would you feel if someone offered to pay for your groceries or give you a meal? These are some of the ways DOVE churches in the Philippines are sharing the love of Christ with their "Kindness in Progress" outreach. They go into a neighborhood with an eye to look for needs, and then meet them wherever possible. This includes serving meals to low income families and other intentional acts of kindness.

The DOVE youth movement in the Philippines can be termed as wildly successful. Lee and Teresa DeMatos, lead elders from DOVE partner church Indian Lake Fellowship, Massachusetts, USA have been instrumental in creating momentum, especially after Lee dressed like Mr. Incredible and dubbed himself "Mr. Identity" in a youth gathering.



This creative twist to evangelism has led to several more church plants. Training of leaders is an ongoing need. The DOVE training school is proving to be effective for raising up leaders, even across denominational lines. We believe that the DOVE family is truly making a difference in the Philippines.

Empowering farmers through technology

Gilbert Mwale was part of DOVE's Destiny Center in Mysore, India while studying there. Now back in Zambia, he is making waves with the introduction of ICT in the agriculture sector. The company he founded, eMsika, is an e-commerce platform that uses face-to face meetings, social media and phone calls to provide farmers with agricultural input and equipment. Buyers can meet sellers to exchange services.

Recently eMsika attained second position in the Young Entrepreneurs of the Year awards in Zambia. Gilbert explains that his heart is full of joy when he sees farmers succeeding, because his goal with eMsika is to lift the standards of small scale farmers across southern Africa. "The grace of God has kept us and allowed us to do things only He can enable us to do," testifies Gilbert.

MYANMAR Persecution on the rise

Christians in Myanmar are facing increased persecution such as detaining, abduction and the invasion of church properties. Religious nationalism, fueled by the majority religion of their



country, is instigating an increase in the fight against ethnic minorities, which includes Christians.

Ram Lian, apostolic leader of DOVE Myanmar, reports that neighbors tried to shut down services at their church. The government social welfare officer advised them to register the orphanage they operate. The application was successful, and two signs were placed outside the compound. Mercy Home is now recognized by authorities, giving protection from hostile neighbors.

By God's grace, the ministry has now grown to 39 churches. A seminar in 2018 with DOVE Myanmar's celebration of three years in the DOVE family was attended by over eighty leaders who learned about DOVE vision.

DOVE Springs SACCO uplifts lives KENYA Micro-loans prove successful

"The success of DOVE Springs SACCO is very encouraging," says Susan Otieno, chairperson. "Our membership is now almost 500 and many families are being helped." With exorbitant interest rates of 20% or more in the open market, DSS brings financial services within the reach of its members.

Micro-loans have become a popular financial alternative in East Africa. SACCO is an acronym for Savings and Credit Cooperative. Since its registration in 2012, DOVE Springs SACCO (DSS) has grown to nearly 500 members and has released over 250 loans. Default rates are low as funds continue to rotate based on low interest pay-backs.

After saving with the SACCO, a member qualifies to apply for a loan. This encourages members to develop the habit of saving, which is a challenge in a context where inflation and unemployment are high. In many developing nations, even people who have jobs need to look for extra sources of income in order to survive. DSS empowers members by holding seminars on financial management, the importance of saving and business principles. Members are helped to seek out viable business ideas.

Pauline Juma started saving with DSS in 2014. When she took a loan last year, she opened a Barber and Salon. "Through the loan, I was able to achieve my long-time dream of having a business that generates income," Pauline shares. "I will forever thank the SACCO."

Charles Wanyama, a DOVE pastor, has taken several loans to establish their school, Joysprings Education Centre. Joysprings is giving over 500 children in the slums of Kibera the opportunity for a good education. "I am ever grateful for the SACCO. I have learned saving skills and have been able to see our school succeed," Charles explains.

Living for Christ where the cost is high

t's fascinating how a literal climate can so accurately reflect a spiritual climate. Where we serve it is often dry and dusty, except for a few months of the year. The ground is rocky and only the hardiest vegetation survives. This is how it feels spiritually. Five times a day the Islamic call to prayer is broadcasted throughout our city, the core of its message in direct opposition to what we are proclaiming.

The area of the world that we live in is considered a "creative access" or "sensitive" region. Students, entrepreneurs, retirees. . . all are welcome here, but it is against the law to proselytize. We run a small business, living with as much integrity as we can while pursuing our greatest calling, which is to share His message of reconciliation. It's discouraging at times because the roots of Islam go so deep and the ground is rocky and hard. But we seek to be faithful in planting seeds, trusting that He is the one that turns hearts of stone into hearts of flesh. We plant seeds through intentional conversations with whoever we can: friends, neighbors, clients, taxi drivers—and wherever we can: over cups of tea in our living room or while standing in line for paperwork.

And praise God, we are starting to see life coming up from this rocky soil! The number of local believers is growing. Their decision to follow Christ comes at more of a cost than it does for those of us living in the west. But they are discovering that Jesus is worth it!

We believe that prayer has been and will continue to be the foundation for the work that God is doing in this part of the world. Please pray with us that eyes would be opened and hearts softened.



GUATEMALA, SOUTH AFRICA GERMANY and SCOTLAND

"I definitely recommend a DMI internship if you want to spread the love of God, experience a new culture, get out of your comfort zone and grow closer to God!" These words come from Tim Witmer, 19, who has just returned from serving six months with Shiloh Community Church in Cape Town, South Africa.

DOVE Mission International launched this program in 2018. Young people have been mentored by church leaders and missionaries in Guatemala, Germany and South Africa. Five others have begun their internships in Peterhead, Scotland, where they will pioneer a youth ministry with Living Waters Community Church. The interns have found this program to be life-changing.

Sage served in Germany with DMI missionaries Justin and Rawan Shrum, who work to see women liberated from being trafficked. She feels one of the biggest lessons has been to serve with

humility. In addition to learning practical ministry skills, interns complete assignments related to world missions and cross-cultural communication.

Host church leaders and missionaries have been encouraged by the ministry of our interns. Colin and Lara Bothma hosted interns who began a youth group in their church in Cape Town. Lara writes how the interns' energy is contagious and how another youth leader has emerged. "The change they are bringing about in the lives of the kids is sustainable; there will be a leader to continue the work once they return to the USA," she explains.

The DMI internship program helps people from DOVE churches in the USA discover the exciting possibilities of missionary service as they learn firsthand the work of world missions.

Get your voice back

ever lost your voice? Perhaps because of a cold or having the wind knocked out of you? God has given each of us a voice for a reason—but have we lost it?

Initially, most people heard about Jesus through personal interaction. Then they shared what they received and heard with others. These disciples gathered in communities, often in homes. They did life together with Jesus and each other. Preachers came to these church communities sharing Scripture, answering questions, and giving direction.

Because these believers were led by the Holy Spirit and gave undeniable witness to Jesus, the churches multiplied. Everywhere they went they took their experience of Jesus with them. The result was an explosion of churches planted. Church planting was a by-product; churches were being planted because believers were going into new areas.

Today it is different. Churches are often planted in order to reach new areas. Has the witness of the believer now been

traded in for the witness of the preacher? I love preaching and preachers, but somehow many believers have lost their voice.

The early believers had a voice: a testimony of what Jesus had done for them. The voice of the preachers was simply the voice of leadership, not necessarily of the entire Christian experience. Little by little, believers traded in their own testimony for the testimony of a preacher. Sadly today, many believers jump from congregation to congregation seeking a preacher to be their voice of Christian expression. Instead of sharing their own testimony, they bring their friends to church so the preacher can share the Gospel with them.

I believe God wants to give His people their voices back. We still need leaders to guide and encourage. But as believers get their voice back, we will again see an explosion of church planting.
